Staff within each room are made in charge of their own 'Starbucks Clean' as they are able to clean more thoroughly with a more flexible timescale whilst adhering to the two-hour policy set. Each room also has their own set of wipes to support cleaning. Bins are filling up quicker with inside bins being emptied every two hours.</p>	<p>All staff are clear on procedures. Setting is able to remain open for families consistently.</p>			
<p>Handwashing Additional handwashing has been implemented upon arrival to setting, hands are visibly dirty, after coughing or sneezing, going from one room to another, before or after garden time, on leaving the setting which is being followed well by all staff within the setting. At each entrance to the building and garden, hand gel stations are in place for adults and monitored. At staff meetings, policy and procedures are reviewed and discussed to ensure everyone is aware of procedures to minimise risk of infection. New outdoor toilet block is supporting children in washing hands when arriving at nursery, playing outside and before going home.</p>	<p>Children's natural behaviour to go and wash their hands. <p>Social Distancing</p> <p>Parents are not able to come into the building along with other professionals. Stay safe buckets are placed two meters apart on the perimeter of the nursery to ensure parents/carers are adhering to government guidance. Parents are aware of key collection times and adhere to these. At times this does mean parents coming in to the nursery garden however as discussed this is monitored through the use of the stay safe buckets and hand gel.</p> <p>Families have been very good at following our guidance as well as the governments guidance therefore we are confident that we are following all of the necessary precautions to the best of our abilities. Much stricter due to new guidance.</p> <p>Parents must wear masks now upon drop off and collection.
