Sterilising Room sterilising is being completed every week ensuring all of the toys and furniture is appropriately cleaned throughout the week. Resources in the cabin and shed must be cleaned every time they are returned to the boxes. Quick air spray is supporting procedures. <p>touched surfaces, bins and technology are all disinfected every 2 hours to ensure the spread of infection is minimised. Babies have altered their times due to lunch/snack but still ensure this is done every 2 hours. Staff within each room are made in charge of their own 'Starbucks Clean' as they are able to clean more thoroughly with a more flexible timescale whilst adhering to the two-hour policy set. <p>Handwashing</p> <p>Additional handwashing has been implemented upon arrival to setting, hands are visibly dirty, after coughing or sneezing, going from one room to another, before or after garden time, on leaving the setting which is being followed well by all staff within the setting.</p> <p>At each entrance to the building and garden, hand gel stations are in place for adults and monitored. At staff meetings, policy and procedures are reviewed and discussed to ensure everyone is aware of procedures to minimise risk of infection. <p>Staff have reviewed the effectiveness of hand washing and ensure this is done for 20 seconds for both children and staff.</p> <p>With staff support, children are great at knowing when to wash their hands (when arriving, before meals, after sneeze/coughs, before going home) and this is encouraged and reiterated daily.</p>		<p>Support children with washing their hands for the recommended length of time – songs/timer</p> <p>Ensure they understand why they are washing their hands and when it is appropriate.</p>		
<p>COVID Emergency Procedure</p> <p>A COVID emergency procedure and box is in place and kept in the outdoor classroom which can be used when required. PPE is worn as normal when required. Practitioners use stories to help children understand about hand washing, self-isolation/lock down at home, social distancing and Coronavirus these are age and stage appropriate. Those who are displaying any COVID-19 symptoms have undergone testing and all children have received a negative result (COVID test and protect folder). <p>are placed two meters apart on the perimeter of the nursery to ensure parents/carers are adhering to government guidance. Parents are aware of key collection times and adhere to these. At times this does mean parents coming into the nursery garden however as discussed this is monitored using the stay safe buckets and hand gel.</p> <p>Families have been very good at following our guidance as well as the governments guidance of following the 1-meter rule, therefore we are confident that we are following all the necessary precautions to the best of our abilities. Parents must wear masks upon drop off and collection.
